The Program



Dr. Joe Harner is serving as the *Department Head of the Biological and Agricultural Engineering Department* at Kansas State University. Currently he is serving on the *Midwest Dairy Scientific Advisory Council, High Plains Dairy Conference* planning committee, *Western Management Dairy Conference* planning committee and *Kansas Water Institute* executive board. He was invited to serve on the *Vision 2050 Dairy Panel* which is identifying critical issues facing the dairy industry in the next 40 years.

As an extension specialist, he authored or co-authored over 300 publications including refereed, experiment station updates, extension publications, conference proceedings and technical papers. He has worked with dairies and beef feedlots in North America, Ukraine, Brazil, South Africa and Japan. He has been instrumental in assisting dairies in stepwise planning of dairy expansion along with helping dairies exploring new facilities ranging in size from 18 to 90,000 cows. He has participated in the heat stress abatement studies as a member of the K-State Dairy team.

He has been instrumental in developing low profile cross ventilated freestall buildings and single row housing systems for smaller groups of dairy cows. Joe has also worked with the K-State Dairy team to develop guidelines for the special needs and feed areas of a dairy. In addition to his dairy efforts, he also has responsibilities in the

beef and grain storage and drying programs at Kansas State. For these efforts he received the 2003 ASABE Gunlogson Countryside Engineering Award and the 2009 ASABE Henry Giese Structures and Environment Award. In 2009, he was a member of the team receiving the USDA Team Award for outstanding integration of research and extension in watershed planning and was recognized as the ASABE Mid Central Engineer of the Year. He is registered professional engineer in Kansas. He and his wife Milly have four children and reside in St. George, Kansas.



Dr. John F. Smith completed a B.S. in 1984 and a M.S. in 1986 at Northwest Missouri State University in Animal Science. In 1990 he completed a Ph.D. at the University of Missouri in Dairy Science. Dr. Smith has served as the *Extension Dairy Specialist* at New Mexico State University from 1989-1995 and as *Extension Specialist, Dairy Science* in at Kansas State University from 1995-2011. Dr. Smith's responsibilities at K-State include *Management of the Dairy, Dairy Commodity Group Leader and Program Leader for Extension in the Department of Animal Sciences and Industries*.

Currently, Dr. Smith serves as *Dairy Extension Specialist/Professor* at The University of Arizona. In 2000 he received the Midwest Outstanding Young Extension Specialist Award, in 2002 the DeLaval Dairy Extension Award, in 2008 he received Western Dairy Business magazine's Outstanding Dairy Industry Educator/Researcher and in 2010 he received

the Bell Tower of Fame Award for his efforts in dairy education and research.

Dr. Smith's interests include cow comfort, heat stress, milking parlor performance, special needs facilities, and management of expanding dairies. Dr. Smith is one of the Co-Founders of the Western Dairy Management Conference and High Plains Dairy Management Conference.

He works throughout the United States and internationally helping producers to develop efficient dairy operations.

Dr. John Smith and Dr. Joe Harner will be presenting as a *Team* this year. Their topics will cover Dairy facility designs, bottlenecks, benefits, and tips for maximum cow comfort and efficiency. We will again have SVM Student events on Thursday and Friday evenings. New this year will be Practice Tips AABP style on Thursday night. We will continue having speakers during meals on Friday.
